Dear Parents:

On the back of this letter, I've included a 'timeline' of important dates that may be of interest to you and your teen. I have also included general information about graduation requirements, OPEN HOUSE visits and what is needed to apply to a DEP in Vocational Education. Please encourage your graduate to make an early appointment to see me. It takes time to plan a future and I want to ensure that they have accurate information before sending any applications. You are also welcome to accompany your graduate or make an appointment of your own to access the Guidance Services.

To graduate from high school, students need to earn a minimum of 54 credits in Secondary IV and V combined, with at least 20 of those credits being at the Secondary V level. As part of these credits, they need to pass Secondary V English and French and Secondary V Phys. Ed. or Ethics, as well as Secondary IV Math, Science, History and the Arts.

The **minimum requirement to enter CEGEP is** a High School diploma (see above), although many programs require additional courses. The following website provides the prerequisite requirements for all CEGEP programs in the province - http://www.mels.gouv.qc.ca/ens-sup/ens-coll/Cahiers/treparti.asp. The minimum requirement to enter most D.E.P.s (tech/voc program) is Secondary IV English, French and Math, although it is highly recommended that students have a High School leaving diploma.

CEGEP applications are due March 1st -all applications received by the deadline will receive equal treatment. (If you are mailing applications, please make sure to give enough time for them to arrive and make sure there is SUFFICIENT POSTAGE). However, the on-line option allows you to pay fees with a credit card and ensures an immediate confirmation that the application has been received. While there is no specific deadline to **apply to a D.E.P. program**, I would suggest that your son/daughter apply as soon as they are confident in their choice (many programs fill quickly, and have waiting lists – most of the programs work on a 'first come-first admitted' policy). You will find a complete list of available programs at www.inforoute.fpt.org

Students have a number of ways to finance their education. Government **Loans and Bursaries** are available, and can be applied for in the <u>spring</u> at www.afe.gouv.qc.ca (the "*Assessment simulator*" function on the loans website can give you an estimate to what they may be entitled). The **awards** that are given as part of the MVHS Awards Program at graduation are applied for in May and application forms will be available following a student assembly in April). Finally, students may also wish to apply for **external scholarships**. The criteria and deadlines for these vary – generally the focus is on strong academic achievement, leadership skills and community involvement and in some cases, financial need. These scholarships are applied for independently by the students. A complete list of external scholarships and bursaries is available in the guidance office.

I will be visiting the Secondary V classes throughout the year to provide the students with information and reminders. I encourage students to make an appointment with me if they have questions about specific programs or schools, or if they simply don't know what they want to do after high school.
