
## Massey Vanier's Raspberry Pi Club: Powering Up

Curious students and staff wandering into our club meetings are usually a little disappointed when they realize we are not producing any baked goods. Their dismay is short lived, however, when their attention and interest quickly turn towards our impressive collection of micro-processors and monitors. Raspberry Pis are versatile, mini computers that are equipped with wi-fi, Bluetooth, and HDMI. They are operating everything from retro games from the 90's to Minecraft, to basic coding and surfing the web.

We are a group of about 10 students from level 2 and 3 as well as one teacher. We meet at least once a week in Mr. Hollenbeck's room (E325) usually on Wednesdays. We are led and directed by the creative genius of our members and by our group's founder, Sam Zigby. In our meetings, are busy with many tasks. We explore the programs on the Pis, try new hardware like adapters, monitors and speakers, play games, and plan our projects. We usually also eat all of Mr. Hollenbeck's chips.

We have recently received a wonderful donation of two additional raspberry pi kits as well as two makey-makey kits from Tanya Bardati and our generous PPO (Parent Participation Organization). Having more Pis has enabled us to increase our numbers and the makey-makey kits are just a lot of fun. These kits come from the brains at MIT and look like a mother board for a controller or keyboard. These circuit boards plug into our Pis via USB and by using alligator clips and various websites, we can turn fruit or any conductive material into a bongo or piano. The other day, we managed to start using one makey-makey kit to play Mario. We hope to program our own game controllers, turn stairs into a piano, figure out how to get lights going on with all of this, and tons of other projects. This generous donation has really powered up the club.

The main project we hope to complete before the end of the year is a retro arcade unit. We plan to complete all the required steps in the shop here at Massey Vanier with the help of the amazing Wesley Patch. Our inspired members have designed detailed blue prints. Mr. Patch has already helped select the materials and make the design of the frame more efficient. The Pi Club has worked on the digital insides. The pi operates on micro SD cards which enables us to mount various programs and video game emulators while others come preloaded with a raspian (linux) operating system. This will be the brains or the CPU of our old school arcade. We are hoping to design the old-fashioned joystick style set-up with two player option using our makey-makey kits. The group is excited and is happy to share our progress. Feel free to swing by on a Wednesday unless Mr. Hollenbeck has an intramural hockey game. Then we meet on Fridays.






